A. Application Process and Eligibility Criteria

1. Applicants must complete an application for admission while enrolled in their junior or senior year at a qualified high school.
2. Applicants must complete the WEIS scholarship application and submit a high school transcript (through mid-senior year) to the financial aid office by the application date. The transcript should clearly indicate the applicant's Grade Point Average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale.
3. Have you been a resident of Wicomico County for at least the past two years?

5. Applicants are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for all local need-based scholarships.

B. Application Deadline

The application deadline is **June 1, 2017.**

C. Award Selection Process

1. After each year's deadline, applicants will be ranked according to Expected Family Contribution (EFC) as determined by the FAFSA.
2. Additionally, applicants will be evaluated on their high school GPA based on a 4.0 scale.
3. Upon award completion, the financial aid office will notify recipients and make arrangements through the admissions office for a Wor-Wic Community College representative to attend the awards presentation at the respective awardee's high school.
